here's "The Lair"

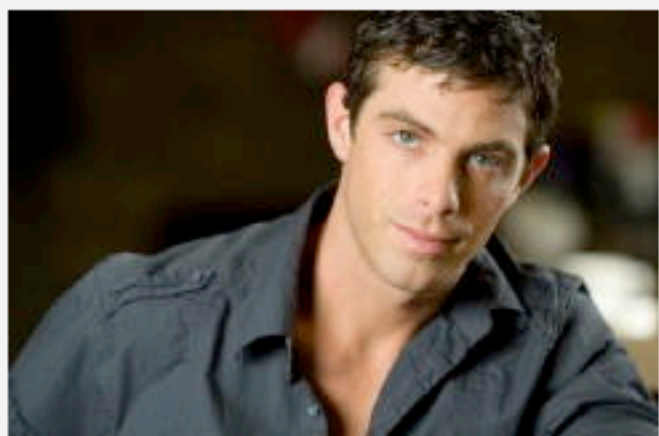
